With Christmas just 25 days away, I ask myself where has the year gone.

November was another successful month filled with our Practice Nights, Country Social Afternoon, AGM and Open Genre Afternoon.

The social was well attended – 71 patrons though the door, an opportunity for artists to sing 2 songs and then a lucky 10 got to sing one more each. All members have replied to the Christmas party and all deposits for those coming have been received.

The social afternoon had some unfamiliar faces in the audience who were visiting from out of town. These visitors heard about our afternoon being advertised on Triple T. They also purchased a couple of our club shirts which was nice to see.

Eddie's AGM President's Report

Firstly, I would like to take this time to thank all of you great people for being part of our Country Music Association. This thanks is extended especially to the great team of dedicated people who help keep the wheels turning on this machine.

The year that was, has been full of great outcomes. We were well represented at all the neighbouring country music festivals by our members and they mostly, had a high proportion of wins at these events.

We introduced the People's Choice award to engage the audience who attend our socials. This was intended to be fun, and the votes were definitely interesting when it came to the counting for the winners. The criteria was to vote for the person you enjoyed the most, not the best person on the day. Our heat winners were Rob, Ray, Diane and Marlene and the "sing off" occurred at our last social. The winner will be announced at our Christmas party and I can't wait to see who the lucky recipient is.

We have added three Open Genre afternoons to the program this year which allowed us to dust our vocal cords off with songs other than country. There were a few of us country stalwarts who still sang country and that added great variety to the mix. Given the positive feedback for these afternoons, we will continue to have them in the schedule for the upcoming year.

We donated our time and sound gear to the Cancer Council fundraising event in May and the afternoon was well supported. Our artists brought their best performances and a good variety of songs. Overall, it was a great afternoon.

We also supported Bunnings in the family nights, Christmas, Easter and Father's Day. Our performers had the kids and adults up rocking and there was even a line up of kids wanting to sing Christmas carols that we stayed for extra time.

We scaled back a little on the Bellevue afternoons. Not for any other reason other than we didn't get our dates in soon enough and they were prebooked. The committee have taken previous feedback regarding the heat into consideration and going forward will try not to perform in this venue after September. We have already discussed new dates and are awaiting confirmation for next year. That also leads me into the dinners we share at the Bellevue. These have been declining in numbers over the last few times and I understand cost is an issue for most of us, but this is a great time to bring us closer as a country music family with the bonding and friendship.

We held our first Cash prized raffle.... \$1000 prizemoney with only 500 tickets. Whilst we managed to sell all the tickets, it was a hard task. Members didn't sell as many books as the committee thought and it was only due to Julie and Glenda selling the bulk of the tickets at bunnings that we managed to achieve the task with a positive outcome. It has now been decided to not fundraise going forward in this manner however our Membership prices increased in compensation for this. This will be reviewed in need as we manage our associations finances.

My last point... leave the best till last... We have upgraded most of our sound system to incorporate the digital world. We have a new digital sound desk, and front of house speakers also support the digital sound. We have new wireless microphones, and our recent and last purchase for the year was D I boxes for the guitars to go into the desk. Given the guitar packs are approx. 12 years old, they have been progressively deteriorating over time and we will no longer be using them, as we are going back to wired leads. Eventually we will replace the wired leads for wireless. After spending close to \$10,000 in new equipment the guitar packs we currently have can't be purchased and the ones on the market are not as good as the ones we have, we are holding off for these for the moment.

Thank you for putting your trust in me as your President, and I look forward to another busy and productive year ahead.


